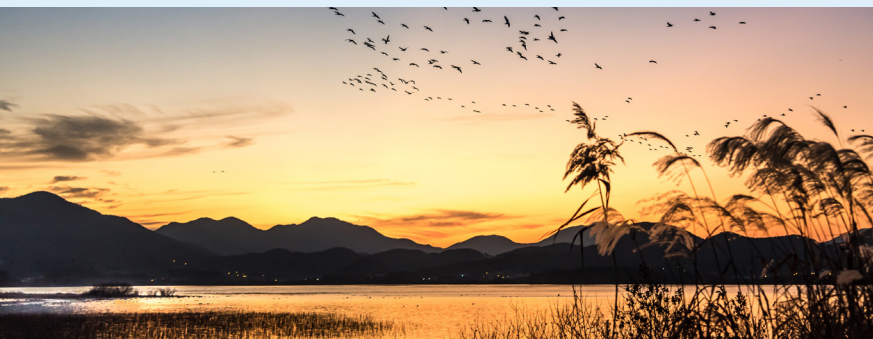

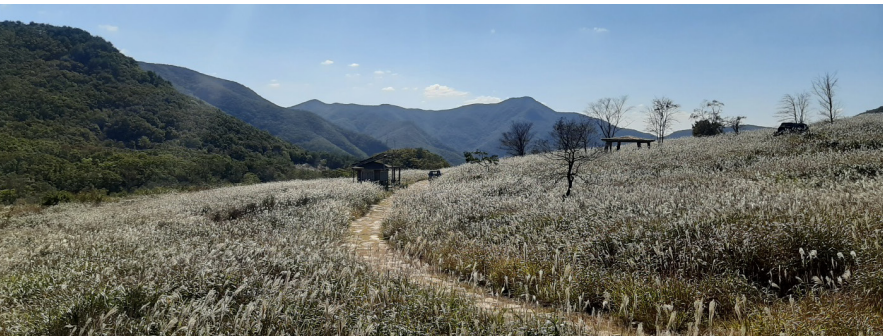


## Uponeup Wetland, Changnyeong 21
