

Polar Biome

A realistic experience of the ecosystem is provided through the five main climate zones - tropical, arid, Mediterranean, temperate, polar - exhibiting 1,600 species (1,400 plant species and 200 animal species) that represent each climate. Exhibition Halls 1 and 2 provide the basic concept of the ecosystem, Special Exhibition Hall offers exhibits on diverse themes and Eco Lab gives ecological education catered to different levels. There is also a Children's Eco Library and a 4D Theater at the Ecorium.

O A reproduction of an arid and barren desert environment ○ 300 species of cacti and succulents, six reptile species





Visitor Center / Medirium

The Visitor Center is a multipurpose space where the ecological media experience hall, observatory and the Seocheon Tourism Promotion Hall are located. The 'Medirium,' an ecological media experience hall, utilizes digital technology such as augmented reality (AR) and motion recognition for ecology-related topics, allowing the visitors to readily experience and enjoy.





- **Mediterranean** O A reproduction of the Mediterranean climate characterized by dry summers and mild, wet winters
 - 300 Mediterranean plant species and seven amphibian species exhibited



Temperate Biome

- O A reproduction of warm temperate or temperate climate in which the four seasons are distinct and summers are hot and humid
- 120 Korean plant species, 40 fish species, seven amphibian and reptile species along with ofters and birds of prey outdoors



Polar Biome

- O A reproduction of the Gaema Plateau, one of the coldest areas of Korean Peninsula, taiga, tundra, polar regions and the King Sejong Station
- O A display of the polar ecosystem with two species of penguins in the Antarctic - the Chinstrap penguin and the Gentoo penguin


Ecorium Zone

A reproduction of 13 major colonies from the Korean climate from evergreen broad-leaved forests to subarctic evergreen coniferous forests


